## An H<sup>4</sup> Culture

The Humility Network is based on four spiritual pillars.

### 1 Humble

In a culture of humility, we toss selfish ambition out the window and truly regard others as better than ourselves. We don't think less of ourselves. We think more of others and serve one another after Jesus's example.

## 2 Hungry

We are unashamedly hungry for more of God and what God can do in our midst. To that end, we engage in a supportive community that offers a combination of prayer, curated learning, solution-oriented brainstorming, and peer accountability to break through current growth barriers in ourselves and our churches. Group members agree to challenge each other to set God-sized goals and accomplish them.

## **3** Holy

Our Wesleyan roots call for "holiness of heart and life." In other words, we are invited to an inward experience and an outward expression of our love for God and neighbor. Holiness is not the result of personal effort or moral rectitude but of abiding in God's presence. We seek to live and lead from a deeply poised center and rely on the Holy Spirit to do far more than we could ever ask or imagine.

## 4 Healthy

God moves most freely in and through us when we are the healthiest version of ourselves. We encourage every spiritual leader to be mentally, emotionally, spiritually and physically healthy. Similarly, churches thrive when they create a culture that is spiritually and emotionally healthy. These cultures freely receive and give the love of Jesus which organically multiples disciples, groups, ministries and churches.

## **Network Values**

#### **→** Community

Increasingly, loneliness and isolation undermine many of our best spiritual leaders and churches. Our first goal is to establish authentic community where we can know and be known, love and be loved. For this group to have a transformational impact on our lives and ministries, we must build deep trust with one another.

### ✦ Humility

Community is fostered by humility. Scripture says to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10). We will honor one another with confidentiality and willingly commit to both give and receive insights and ideas to promote the good of others. We believe when one of us wins, all of us win.

### ✦ Honesty

A leader's first job is to define reality. With total honesty, we will assess the real issues of ministry in our respective contexts, lay them on the table, and admit where we need insight or practical ideas to move forward.

#### Collaboration

We are better than me. Through a group mastermind approach, solution-oriented brainstorming will generate creative ideas that can define a key goal, design a plan to achieve it, and turn vision into reality.

### ★ Accountability

Mutual, loving accountability enables us to be who God calls us to be and accomplish the things that are most important. Our aim is to hold one another accountable spiritually and missionally. As we implement our plans, both our success stories and problems will come to the group. Success stories will be applauded (loudly!), and problems will be solved through prayer and collective creative thinking.
